March 9, 2010- Gold County Tour

- 9:30 Depart Sacramento
- 10:30 Tour the Marshall Gold Discovery Park & Museum. Learn to pan for gold...seek your fortune. The town of Coloma is nearly hidden within a densely forested section of the America River Canyon. It was here in 1848 at Sutter's Mill that James Marshall initiated the California Gold Rush with a single sentence, "Boys, I believe I've found gold!"
- 12:00 Lunch at the Sequoia restaurant Originally built by Colonel Fredrick Bee in 1853, the house lies just 8 miles from the gold discovery site at Sutter's Mill. It was a bastion of civilized hospitality during the rough-and-tumble gold rush era. This beautifully restored mansion is California Gold Country's blossoming treasure.
- 1:15 **Wild West Walking Tour of Historic Main Street**
Also known as "Old Hangtown, Placerville is a charming California "gold rush" town named after the placer gold deposits found in its' river beds and hills in the late 1840's. In the center of town stands the Bell Tower, which has watched over the activities on Main Street for more than 100 years. Placerville Hardware is **the oldest hardware store, west of the Mississippi, and has served the community for over 150 years.**
